Resources in California:

- **Parent Training and Information Centers**

Parent Training and Information Centers (PTI's) are located throughout the United States. They work with families of infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities, birth to 26, helping parents participate effectively in their children's education and development. They also partner with professionals and policy makers to improve outcomes for all children with disabilities. There are several PTI's located within California. - **Regional Centers**

Regional centers are nonprofits that contract with the Department of Developmental Services to provide or coordinate services and supports for individuals with developmental disabilities. A child may receive Early Start services through the Regional Center, but they need to be found eligible to continue to receive services from them at age 3.
