• Learn the Signs. Act Early.

This website provides a way to find out what skills a child should have by a certain age, from two months to five years of age. You can download a checklist, or go to the "Milestones in Action" tab to see photos and videos of each age and skill.

You can input your child's information, including your child's age, and it will provide you with a list of the expected skills your child should attain, and guide you in talking with your pediatrician or other specialists, if you suspect your child has a delay in any area.
