### **Engagement with Families Remains High**



PHP touched nearly 200,000 families through 16,000+ direct services to 6,200+ parents and professionals, and an additional 176,000+ families receiving information online!



78% of families served by PHP represent communities of color. PHP continues to provide all information and services in 3 languages.



PHP runs, on average, 25 FREE monthly support groups in three languages. Participants come from the Bay Area, California, the United States, and internationally!



PHP hosted 615 webinars, online support groups, and other meetings via Zoom. That's ~50 a month!



87% of PHP program staff are parents of a loved one with a disability, making PHP uniquely qualified to serve families through our shared lived experiences



8,812 parents, professionals, and caregivers attended online PHP webinars, support groups, and other training opportunities.



PHP E-Learning Library videos were watched for 5,600+ hours, a 60% Increase from 2021!



58% of families served by PHP reside in Santa Clara County, CA. For the first time, the 2nd largest service area (4%) is outside the Bay Area, in LA County!






### **Diagnoses Served by PHP\***

## 2021-2024 STRATEGIC GOALS

# GOAL #1: EXPAND LOCAL, STATE & NATIONAL SERVICES



Parents Helping Parents will transition to a post-pandemic world by significantly expanding local, statewide, and national services to families with special needs. Special emphasis will be on online opportunities for those with digital literacy/access, and expansion of local offices and outreach to underserved communities.

#### **FALL 2022 STATUS:**



PHP opened two neighborhood offices in Santa Clara County, CA, in 2022. These are in East San Jose and Gilroy and envelope the 5 most in-need PHP zip codes. One additional neighborhood office is in the works, and a contract from a large hospital network in Santa Clara County is pending. Additionally, LA county is now the 2nd most-served county by percentage (4%) of all PHP services.

## GOAL #2: INCREASE ADVOCACY EFFORTS



Parents Helping Parents will grow an advocacy program capable of reaching 100,000 people through parent center partners and social media networks to mobilize future parent leaders, create system change, and provide political power for families.

#### **FALL 2022 STATUS:**



PHP launched 15 grassroots advocacy campaigns through social media and its 26,000+ member email list. Campaigns generated 5,700 emails and petition signatures sent to local, state, and federal lawmakers in support of legislation benefiting children and adults with disabilities. 1,000 people shared PHP campaigns with others.

## GOAL #3: CALIFORNIA ADULT SERVICES LEADER





#### **FALL 2022 STATUS:**



Parents Helping Parents will lead the development of a statewide hub of information for all parents/caregivers of adults or young adults with disabilities, including a focus on person-centered transition and life plans.

PHP launched Connections California: Transition to Adulthood in January 2022. As of September 2022, Connections California hubs are online In English and Spanish. More than 40 online events, attended by 1,400+ individuals, have been held In English, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
